HEALTH AND SAFETY SUMMARY

Packing List

Required items

- Valid Passport good for at least 6 months prior to the end of your trip.
 - Save a photo of the photo page of your passport.
- Medications and prescriptions
- Print out of your itinerary in case required by immigration.
- Proof of ticket for departing the country.
- Wallet with Credit Card or other form of payment.



- Note that you may need to inform your bank or credit card company of your travel plans.
- Any Emergency IDs, Tags (as needed)
- Emergency cash (\$100USD in smaller bills recommended)
- All items for personal hygiene

Recommended Items

Your accommodation will provide you with sheets, pillows, blankets, etc. There are filtered water dispensers at all program locations for refilling water bottles.

- Water bottle
- Cell phone with cables (110 volt)
- Laptop or device for writing
- Sunscreen, after-sun care
- Insect repellent
- Laundry bag
- Head lamp
- Extra towel
- Wet wipes or toilet tissue (public bathrooms don't provide).

- Sun glasses
- Hat
- Comfortable foot wear for walking.
- Closed toed shoes.
- Sandals
- Swim gear, including a swim shirt for sun protection when snorkeling
- Casual, comfortable clothes for warm to hot climate.
- Casual, nicer clothes for eating/going out.
- Work-out clothing
- Rain jacket
- Clinical attire (as relevant)

Regarding dress and conduct, "when in Rome, do as the Romans do". We promote respect for and of other cultures in the places where you're a guest. Latin America and the Caribbean is culturally conservative. There are exceptions, but we're focusing on the prevailing culture.

As-such, visitors should dress appropriately for the event or location. When at the beach or pool, a modest swimsuit is appropriate (Thong bikinis are not recommended). When visiting Maya Archeological sites, Cultural visits, around town, clinics, classroom and at the hotel, we



urge you to dress modestly. Avoid crop tops, spaghetti straps, yoga pants, short shorts, and so forth. Males should always wear a shirt, unless at the pool or beach.

Weather & Travel

Visitors enjoy Belize year-round, and particularly in the winter. It's warm to hot and waters are near-perfect temperature for swimming, year-round.

Please note:

- The coolest time of year occurs from November through mid-March. This is when temperatures are ideal.
- The hottest time of year occurs from mid-March through Mid-May. This is the dry season, and it is very hot!
- The wettest month is October.
- Belize City experiences rainfall approx. 135 days out of the year. Rainy conditions rarely persist more than a few hours.
- Hurricane events are rare. Hurricane season runs from June through November.
